WHEREAS, Washington County did agree to assume control, jurisdiction of, and responsibility for, in full and every respect the former section of US 95 from Milepost 82.758 to Milepost 82.966 in the Road Closure and Maintenance Agreement dated December 18, 2000; and

WHEREAS, the new facility opened to traffic July 16, 1999.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the former portion of US 95 from Milepost 82.758 to Milepost 82.966 be removed from the State Highway System and relinquished to Washington County effective February 1, 2001. Coincident with said removal, all jurisdiction, control, and interest of the state in and to said sections of former US 95 including rights-of-way appurtenant thereto, all as shown on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, are relinquished to Washington County as its interest may appear.

On behalf of the City of Idaho Falls, I am writing to express appreciation for your interest and assistance in seeking a solution to the funding dilemma and construction schedule involving the I-15/Sunnyside Road Interchange Project. As we understand the situation, ITD currently lacks sufficient funding to proceed with construction of the entire project. During earlier conversations, we understood current funding levels allow ITD to proceed with design and environmental assessment of the entire project and construct the I-15 interchange. Then, as future funding is available, the balance of the project, which includes the Snake River Bridge, and that portion of Sunnyside Road connecting the interchange to Yellowstone Highway would be constructed.

Approaching the project in this manner provides a critical benefit to the community by allowing I-15 access to a major development and employer in the near future, and maintaining the integrity of the project as planned. 

RE: The Railroad Track Modernization Act of 2001.

Dear Senator Craig:

The Idaho Transportation Board requests your support for H.R. 1020 and S. 1220, the Railroad Track Modernization Act of 2001. This Act would provide \$350 million a year for three years for short line and regional railroad track rehabilitation. The Act establishes a program of federal capital grants administered by the states to rehabilitate, preserve, or improve freight railroad track (including roadbeds, bridges, and related track structures) to a standard ensuring that it can be operated safely and efficiently and accommodate 286,000-pound rail cars.

Short line railroads help keep the rural, less populated areas of the country connected to the national railroad main line network. Short lines often take over track that was marginal in the Class I railroad system because it did not generate enough traffic to justify sufficient investment. With a lower cost structure and more flexible service, short line railroads have been able to keep most, but not all of these lines, operational. However, the revenue is still not adequate in some instances to make up for past years of neglect. For example, in Idaho the Camas Prairie RailNet, a short line railroad, abandoned the line from Spalding to Grangeville in 2000 because the costs of upgrading the track and structures were too great after years of deferred maintenance.

Related to the deferred-maintenance issue is the fact that heavier, 286,000-pound cars, which is the new industry standard of the Class I railroads, require substantially higher investment in the track. The short line railroad companies must meet these higher standards to adequately serve their customers, or they may lose their traffic base to other modes or other locations. Without the financial resources to handle the new rail cars, short lines may be forced to abandon more lines, and the traffic is shifted to trucks with resultant impacts on state highways and local roads.

It is our understanding that many of the railroad capital improvement projects eligible for funding under the Act can be implemented quickly. The Act would provide a needed system for preserving essential local rail services in rural areas, as well as a mechanism that can be implemented quickly to stimulate national and local economies.
